

Steps to Better Cell Services in Eastern Ontario

The Eastern Ontario Wardens' Caucus (EOWC) created the Eastern Ontario Regional Network (EORN) to improve connectivity across the region. Together, they have proposed a \$213 million public-private partnership to improve cell coverage in rural Eastern Ontario. The project would be funded by federal, provincial and municipal governments as well as private-sector telecommunications providers.

EORN is committed to an open, accountable and timely approach to building the project. With government funding in place, it will take 12 to 18 months for the project to begin construction. Proper due diligence and an open, competitive bidding process will ensure that the cell improvements are delivered effectively and with good value.
